## THE UNEMPLOYMENT FUND - NATIONAL DISASTER BENEFIT CRIB NOTES FOR BUSY BUSINESS OWNERS



The Unemployment Insurance Fund will compensate affected workers through a new "National Disaster Benefit" and its existing Illness, Reduced Work Time and Unemployment benefits. (Only applicable for employers registered with UIF)

National Disaster Benefit	REDUCED WORK TIME	ILLNESS BENEFITS	Death Benefit
<ul> <li>The new National Disaster Benefit will come into play in instances where an employer decides to close an office for a temporary period, and is unable to pay their staff, as a direct results of the Corona Virus.</li> <li>This is a stand alone benefit and not linked to normal UIF rules.</li> <li>It is a flat rate of R3500 per employee for duration of shutdown or a maximum of 3 months (whichever comes first)</li> <li>If an employee is ill, temporary layoff or unemployed for longer than three months, the normal UIF benefits as explained below will apply.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Where a company implements reduced or short time.</li> <li>Benefit payable is the difference between what employer pays and normal UIF benefits payable should an employee lose employment.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Where an employee has been quarantined for 14 days</li> <li>UIF Illness Benefit process will apply.</li> <li>Changes <ul> <li>A Confirmation Letter from both the employer and employee must be submitted together with the application as proof that both have agreed to the 14 days 'special leave'.</li> <li>In this instance the letters will stand in place of the medical certificate</li> <li>Quarantined for more than 14 days, a medical certificate from a medical practitioner is required</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>When a contributor passes away</li> <li>Benefits are paid to the beneficiaries of the deceased.</li> <li>People eligible to apply are a Spouse, Life Partner, Children and nominated persons, in that order.</li> </ul>
